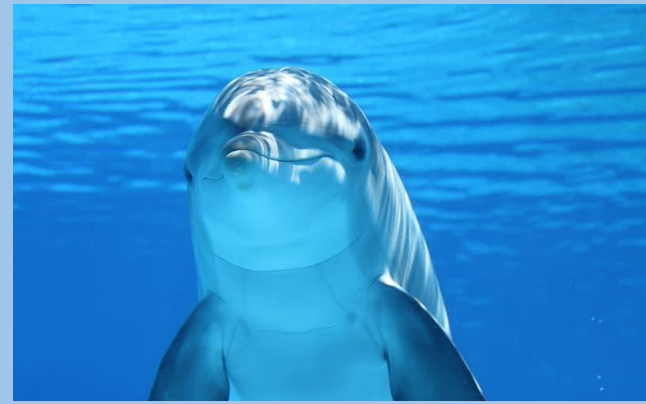
Bottlenose dolphin habitat

- Bottlenose dolphins have one main way of getting food though it's not there only, echolocation.
- Echolocation is when they make noise that will travel through the water and hit something and bounce back. Then they will be able to know where food is.
- They also do a mud ring.
- This is when one dolphin will make a ring of mud around some fish then the fish will panic and the dolphins will be able to eat.
- They have one more way, a pod of Bottlenose dolphins will chase fish onto the beach that will make the fish fall back into their mouths when they reach the beach.
- They also have predators. These include many types of sharks. Like a lot.

- Did you know Bottlenose dolphins sleep with one eye open to watch out for predators.
- They can also grow up to 15 feet
- Bottlenose Dolphins are mammals so they give live birth and are warm blooded.
- They can swim up to 22 miles per hour.
- They can weigh up to 1,100 pounds.
- Bottlenose dolphins can live to be 55 years old.
