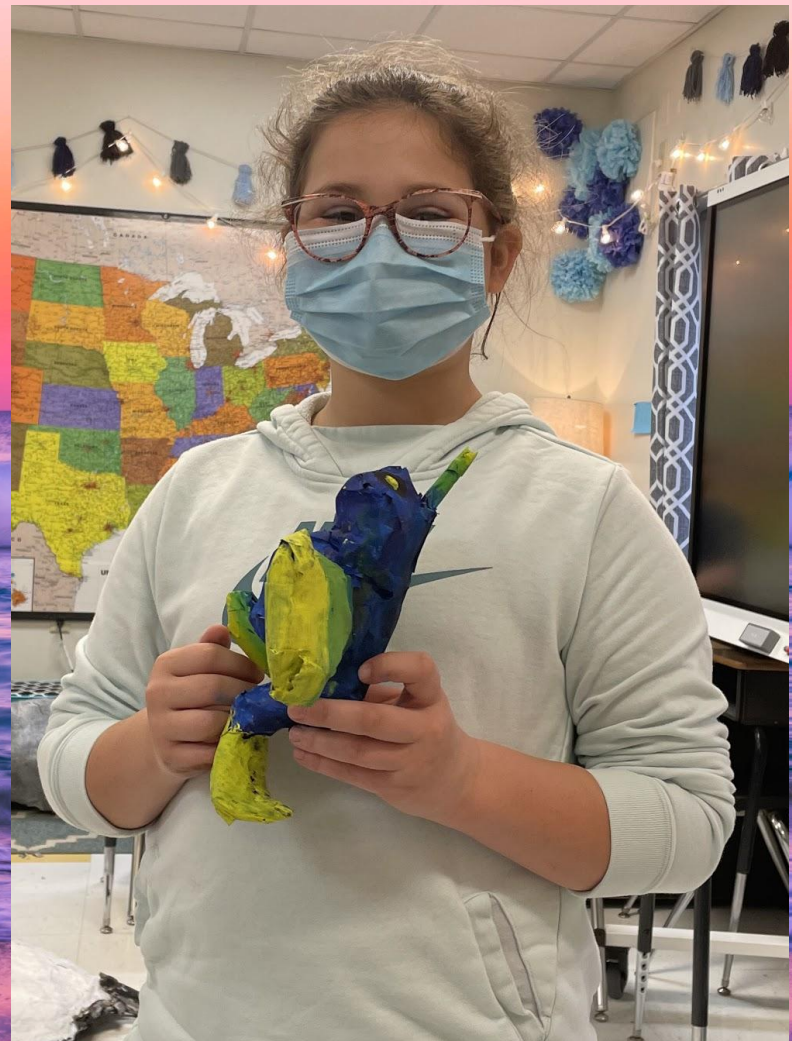


Seahorses

- Seahorses live in Africa, coral reefs, seagrass, and warm sea water

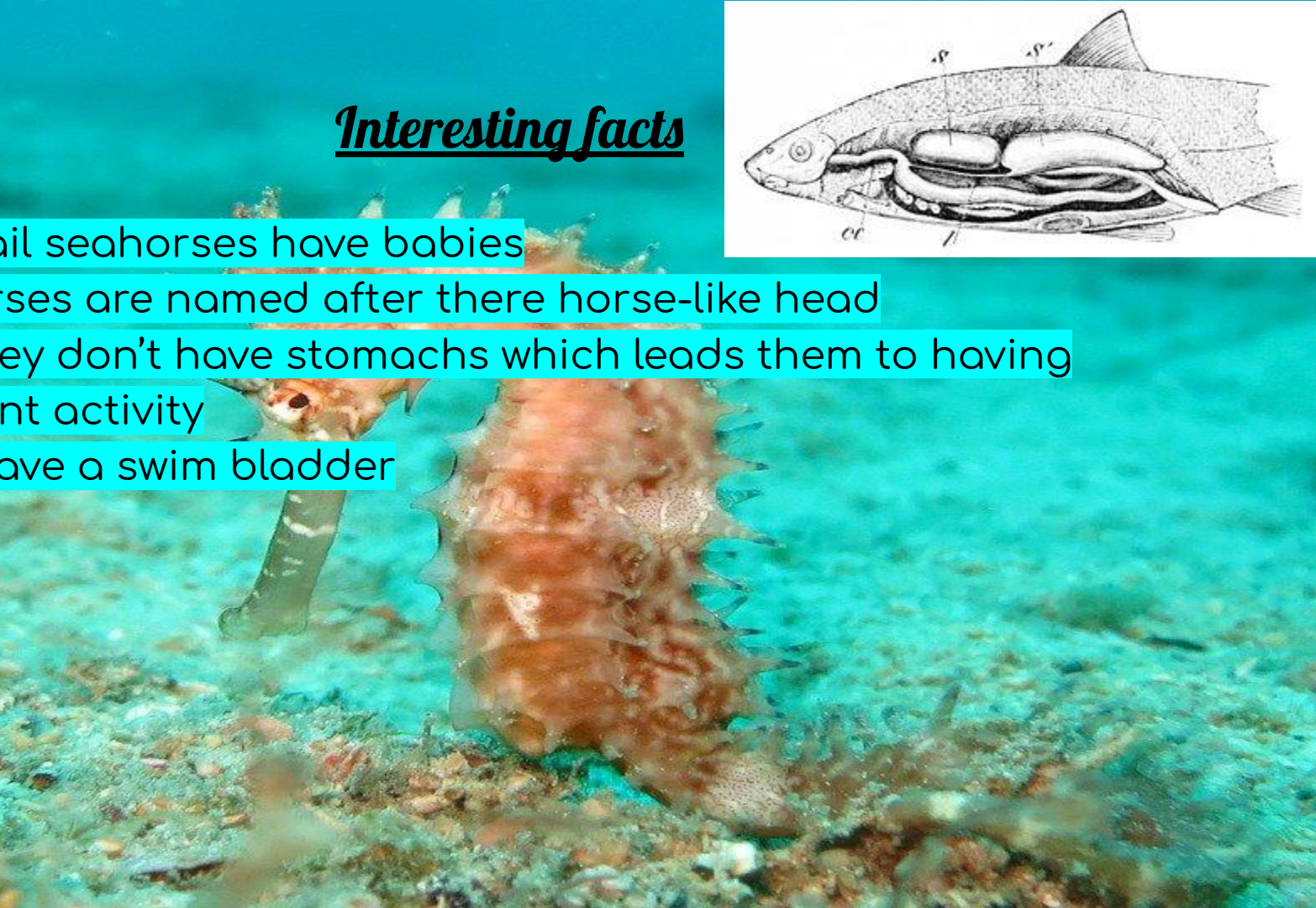
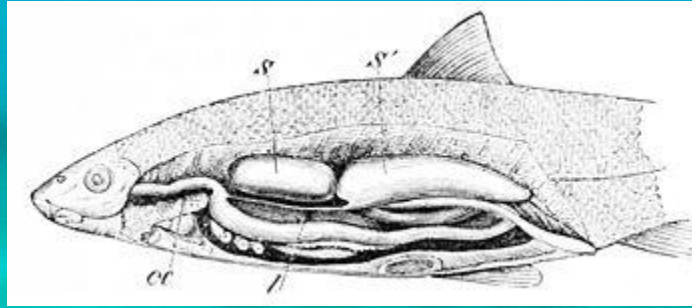
Diet and predators

Leatherback Sea Turtle

Did you know that leatherback sea turtles are the largest species of sea turtles in the world? There are only about thirty-five thousand nesting leatherbacks left today compared to one hundred and fifteen nesting hawks in 1980. Their scientific name is Dermochelys Coriacea. Turtles are considered a type of reptile. It's quite a cold blooded animal with scales. The average sea turtle on land and in water. There are eight habitats in the world it they live in.

This is the only sea turtle that does not have a shell and big scales. Although it does not have big scales and a shell, it does have very big fins. These fins are like paddles to help them swim through the water. The back flippers are like a steering wheel. This sea turtle can be as long as seven feet. They can weigh up to two thousand pounds.

They eat a lot of jellyfish and sea squirts. The sea turtles go to the depths of the ocean to eat their food. It has been discovered that they like to eat of sea squirts or marine sponges and shells.
